DOUGLAS FIR

Application: Interior/Exterior (when treated)

Origin: North America

Chemical Treatment: Water-repellent preservative for outdoor use. Douglas Fir, a product of the Pacific Northwest, is a durable and attractive wood that is ideal for indoor furniture applications but also well suited for outdoor furniture applications when clear grade and chemically treated wood is used. Varying in shades from salmon to bone when milled, Douglas Fir weathers to a medium gray in outdoor environments.

IPE

Application: Exterior/Interior

Origin: South America

Chemical Treatment: None

A beautifully grained, dense South American hardwood that is over 6 times harder than Western Red Cedar. The inherent hardness, durability and strength of Ipe makes it virtually impervious to the elements and ideally suited for heavy commercial use while, at the same time, enabling it to resist rot, decay, insect infestation and vandals' tools. A light to medium brown when milled, Ipe weathers to a soft gray.



MAHOGANY

Application: Exterior/Interior

Origin: South America

Chemical Treatment: None

Mahogany is a medium hardwood whose renowned beauty makes it a favorite of fine furniture makers around the world. While right at home indoors, Mahogany also exhibits unsurpassed weathering capabilities in a variety of different outdoor climates and resists rot, decay, insect infestation and vandals' tools. A deep, rich reddish-brown when milled, Mahogany weathers to a bright silver gray.



PURPLEHEART

Application: Exterior/Interior

Origin: South America

Chemical Treatment: None

Purpleheart is a dense South American hardwood that shares many of the same characteristics as Ipe, and is equally able to withstand the rigors of both the environment and heavy commercial use. As its name implies, Purpleheart is a deep blood purple when milled and weathers to a warm, medium gray.

NOTE: This chart is merely a guide. Actual wood colors and grains may vary slightly.
